The IMPROVE workshop has been delivered to clinicians throughout Australia and New Zealand and is now being adapted to the US setting! We are thrilled to host IMPROVE expert clinician trainers from Australia, including Dr Vicki Flenady, Co-Director, Stillbirth Centre of Research Excellence; Dr Adrienne Gordon, neonatologist; Dr Fran Boyle, social scientist; Dr Jane Dahlstrom, pathologist; and Dr Christoph Lehner, MFM.

Stillbirth Equity Symposium speakers will include our Australian colleagues as well as Dr Alex Heazell, University of Manchester; Deanna Stuart-Butler, Senior Advisor, Indigenous Research and Co-lead Equity and Diversity, Stillbirth Centre of Research Excellence, Australia; Count The Kicks (invited); and Utah Dept of Health & Human Services (invited).

Symposium sessions will be action-oriented and include panels for: Parent voice; Stillbirth pathology and equity, including financial and cultural barriers to access and consent; Rainbow Clinic model of care and access in the context of the US insurance landscape; Research updates; Next steps for a Safer Baby Bundle for the US in the context of high regional inequities; and more! <u>Program updates</u> will be posted starting in June.

### What is IMPROVE?

- A <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> day training workshop to improve quality of care around stillbirth
- 6 stations:
  - Communicating with parents about autopsy
  - Autopsy and placental examination
  - Investigation of death
  - Examination of baby
  - Audit and classification of causes of death
  - o Respectful and supportive bereavement care
- Interactive learning
- Pre- and post-assessments for knowledge and feedback

### Who is IMPROVE for?

- All healthcare providers involved in care of parents during and after stillbirth: MFMs, nurses, midwives, social workers, pathologists, psychologists, psychiatrists, sonographers, obstetricians, neonatologists; Also open to those working in public health and health policy
- October 13<sup>th</sup> workshop has ~40 slots, of which ~30 are reserved for individuals wishing to become trained as IMPROVE educators

### Should I apply to become an IMPROVE educator?

- Our vision is to provide IMPROVE workshops around the country. Would you like to help realize this vision?
- IMPROVE Educator applicants must:
  - Be able to attend both the IMPROVE workshop on 13<sup>th</sup> October and the two-part certification on 13<sup>th</sup> October (Training of Trainers) and 14<sup>th</sup> October (practice for certification)
  - Be willing to serve as a volunteer Educator for at least 1 subsequent IMPROVE workshop in the USA in the next 12 months (costs covered but time must be donated)
  - Have experience/skills in education/training
  - Provide your CV and a statement of interest.
